Christmas Winter Wonderland

Uniform

Attendance at school matters... a lot! Our children learn new things every day in school so it is very important that children miss as few school days as possible. There is a direct link between children's attendance at school and their academic achievement (progress). Attendance also



impacts greatly on your child's physical, social and emotional well-being.

Please do <u>not</u> book holidays during term time as all absences can have a detrimental impact on your children's learning and progress.

Currently our whole school attendance is 94.6%, but there have been lots of nasty bugs going around this month so we are hopeful our overall attendance figure will improve in the New Year.

Christmas is an exciting time, with a whole lot going on in the world, so it's all too easy to let our fascination with the online world distract us from what's really important - spending time with our families. 
