# Parents' Evenings

Parents' Evenings will be held virtually again this term as staff feel this is a much more efficient way of meeting with parents. They are planned for week commencing 21<sup>st</sup> November. Further information will follow. There will also be an 'Open Classroom' event after Parent Evenings, allowing you the opportunity to come into school to share your child's learning with your child.

#### Attendance

Attendance at school matters... a lot! Our children learn new things every day in school so it is very important that children miss as few school days as possible. There is a direct link between children's attendance at school and their academic achievement (progress). Attendance also



impacts greatly on your child's physical, social and emotional well-being. Please do not book holidays during term time as all absences can have a detrimental impact in your children's learning and progress.

Attendance is recorded each week in our weekly newsletter 'The Heygarth Herald' and a reward is given to the class with the highest attendance each week.

This year we will continue to follow guidelines issued by the ESW for attendance. Penalty Notices may be considered appropriate in the following circumstances:

- Attendance below 90% with at least 10 days lost due to unauthorised absence. These do not need to be consecutive.
- 5 days or more unauthorised absence due to holidays in term time, taking into consideration your child's attendance.
- A pupil arrives late after the registers are closed (using a code U) on 10 or more separate occasions.

Any parents wishing to take their child out of school during term time need to complete a form 'Application for Leave of absence of child from school in exceptional circumstances' and also provide a covering letter. This form is available from the school office and should be returned to the school office for consideration.

#### Parking

We are continuing to receive complaints from neighbours regarding parents parking on grass verges, blocking driveways and blocking the road. Most recently, from residents living in Hillary Road and parents blocking driveways on this road and preventing our neighbours from leaving their homes to get to work and/or take their children to school.

Please be respectful of our neighbours by not blocking their driveways or parking on their grass verges.

Please also remember that stopping on the yellow zigzags lines outside of school is both selfish and dangerous not to mention illegal.

Yellow <u>zig-zag lines outside schools</u>, hospitals, or fire, police or ambulance stations indicate the length of road where stopping or waiting is <u>strictly</u> prohibited. The Highway Code states that you should keep these areas clear of stationary vehicles, even if picking up or setting down children.

On Friday 4<sup>th</sup> November we say a fond farewell to Mrs Bethell who has worked in our office since 2018. She has been fortunate to gain a promotion in another school. We would like to thank her for her service to Heygarth and wish her well in her new post. Thank you!




Following a rigorous interview process, we will be welcoming Mrs J Harris to our school office after half-term to take the place of Mrs Bethell.

Even though <u>all</u> children in Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 are entitled to a free meal at lunchtime each day, we still need any parents who claim benefits to register for Free School Meals as this ensures that school continues to receive enhanced funding for their children and also ensures that they receive their free milk entitlement. Key Stage 2 children also need to be registered for Free School Meals if they qualify for the same reason, i.e. milk and school funding.
